Subject: Recognition letter for Northern State Medical University, Arkhangelsk.

Sir,

This has reference to your letter dated Nil, on the subject noted above. Your kind attention is invited to :

- i) Section (3) & (4) of the Eligibility Regulation i.e. "Requirement for taking admission in an undergraduate medical course in a foreign Medical Institution regulation, 2002", which read as under:-

(3) "An Indian citizen, who has passed the qualifying examination either from the India or an equivalent examination from abroad and is desirous of joining an undergraduate medical course in any foreign medical institution on or after 15th March, 2002 shall approach the council for issue of an Eligibility Certificate for that purpose."

(4) "The request for issue of Eligibility Certificate shall be made by the candidate in the proforma prescribed by the Council and shall be accompanied by the original certificate/mark-sheet (alongwith Photostat copy) of the qualifying examination. The original certificate shall be returned to the candidate after verifying the same with the photostat copy which shall be retained by the Council. Request shall also be accompanied by a Demand Draft for the specified sum in favour of Secretary, Medical Council of India, New Delhi. The fee shall be fixed by the Council."

- ii) Section 13(4A) of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 which reads as under:

"A person who is a citizen of India and obtains medical qualification granted by any medical institution in any country outside India recognised for enrolment as medical practitioner in that country after such date as may be specified by the Central Government under sub-section (3), shall not be entitled to be enrolled on any Medical Register maintained by a State Medical Council or to have his name entered in the Indian Medical Register unless he qualified the screening test in India prescribed for such purpose and such foreign medical qualification after such person qualifies that said screening test shall be deemed to be the recognised medical qualification for the purposes of this Act for that person."

iii) Section (3) and 4(1) of the Screening Test Regulations, 2002, which reads as under:-


(3) "An Indian Citizen possessing a primary medical qualification awarded by any medical institution outside India who is desirous of getting provisional or permanent registration with the Medical Council of India or any State Medical Council on or after 15.3.2002 shall have to qualify a screening test conducted by the prescribed authority for that purpose as per the provisions of Section 13 of the Act.

Provided that a person seeking permanent registration shall not have to qualify the screening test if he/she had already qualified the same before getting his/her provisional registration."

4(1)"No person shall be allowed to appear in the Screening Test unless he/she is a citizen of India and possesses any primary medical qualification, either whose name and the institution awarding it are included in the World Directory of Medical Schools, published by the World Health Organization; or which is confirmed by the Indian Embassy concerned to be a recognised qualification for enrolment as medical practitioner in the country in which the institution awarding the said qualification is situated."

In view of above every candidate after passing the medical qualification from abroad which should be registrable with Medical Council of that country must pass the screening test before provisional registration is granted by State Medical Council/Medical Council of India.
